#### WHY THIS FILM

**Serving** in the U.S. Armed Forces is an honorable path that should be celebrated and applauded. Yet the value of this service is not always reflected in **Veterans'** experiences upon leaving the military. They often face problems related to difficulties in transitioning from military life to civilian life, which can involve navigating complex bureaucracy to access benefits; the effects of traumatic or moral injuries; and the systemic differences between military and civilian worlds.

Working with communities to get past differences, share resources and come together for the greater good not only for their Veteran population, but for the benefit of the entire community, is the mission of Maurice Wilson and Vic Martin. #### THE CAST

Master Chief Petty Officer, U.S. Navy, Retired, **Maurice Wilson** is currently the President/Executive Director of the National Veterans Transition Services, Inc. Troubled by the high unemployment, homelessness, growing suicide rates and other issues associated with military to civilian reintegration, Mr. Wilson designed REBOOT, a behavior-based transition program designed to help returning service members and Veterans/families successfully reintegrate back into civilian life after years of military service.



Medically-retired U.S. Navy Mineman, Victor E. Martin, is an advocate, educator and keynote speaker focused on Veteran issues related to active-duty service members transitioning into civilian/Veteran life and on those struggling with reintegration while living with mental health diagnoses. Through his own mental health experiences, he has developed a level of understanding, patience and empathy that allows for true peer-to-peer mentorship and leadership.

With over six years of experience as an Aviation Electronic Technician in the US Navy, **Rachel Oswalt**, now a Veteran, witnessed the poor state of mental health in the military and the lack of adequate support and resources for Active Duty and Veterans. She left the service with a mission to make a positive difference in Washington State and to empower others to overcome challenges, reintegrate into civilian life and achieve their goals. Rachel is working with Maurice Wilson and Vic Martin to bring a Center for Military and Veteran Reintegration to her Oak Harbor, WA community.
